THE PARISH MISSION OPENS tomorrow, March 19th and runs through Wednesday, March 21st. See you there!

HOLY WEEK is ordered to the commemoration of Christ's Passion, beginning with his Messianic entrance into Jerusalem. (Universal Norms, 31).

ON PALM SUNDAY, The early morning Mass will start at 7:30 a.m. – one half hour earlier than usual – because the Passion (Mk 14:1–15:47) is read, extending each Mass.

GOOD FRIDAY is a day of both **Abstinence** and **Fasting**. Abstinence requires that every person 14 years of age and older not eat meat (or any item made with meat) that day. Fasting requires that every person between the ages of 18 and 59 eat only one full meal, (with the two other meals greatly pared back) that day.

40 DAYS FOR LIFE started on Ash Wednesday and will continue until March 25. During this time, all of us are asked to pray for all people whose lives may be in jeopardy, and this definitely includes the preborn whose mothers may be considering abortion. St. Peter parishioners will be holding another silent, prayerful vigil at the Founders' Women's Clinic, 1243 East Broad Street, **TODAY, March 18**, from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Is our Lord calling you to show your concern for the sanctity of life? Please consider giving one hour of your time that day and join other parishioners in prayer as we show our support for the preborn and for an end to abortion. ◆ **BAPTISM** – Baptisms are regularly scheduled EXCEPT DURING LENT: (1) At the 11:30 a.m. Mass on the first Sunday of each month. (2) At 12:30 p.m. on the third Sunday of each month. There is a Pre-Baptism class (in English) on the third Tuesday of each month at 7:00 p.m. in the Red Room. Parents must register in advance of the class. There is a Pre-Baptism class (in Spanish) on the last Wednesday of every month at 6:30 p.m. in the Blue Room. There will be no Baptisms during Lent.

◆ **MARRIAGE** – Engaged couples should make an appointment with one of the priests or deacons at least six months in advance of their anticipated wedding. Participation in Pre-Cana and the Focus program are required. Only the priest or deacon who will be witnessing the marriage can set the date.

◆ **MINISTRY OF THE SICK** – If you are scheduled to be hospitalized, please call before your admission or contact the priest after Mass to receive the Sacrament. Please notify the Rectory whenever a member of your family or a neighbor is hospitalized so that the priests and deacons can visit. Hospital chaplains provide for the sacramental needs of patients. Please notify the Parish if anyone is confined to home and needs to be visited by the priest.

◆ **PARISH MEMBERSHIP** – New members, please stop by the Welcome Center Sunday, 9:00 a.m.-1:00 p.m. or the Parish Office between 9:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m., Monday-Thursday, and 9:00 a.m.-Noon on Friday. Spanish speaking members attending the 7:00 p.m. Mass, stop by the Welcome Center after Mass.

REFLECTION ON THE PENITENTIAL PSALM #102 – PRAYER IN TIME OF DISTRESS

We live in more sterile and politically correct times than did the psalmist. Today, heads would wag if we composed such prayers as this that dares tell God what to do. Notice the number of imperatives within the first six lines: “hear my prayer,” “let my cry come,” “do not hide your face,” “turn your ear to me.” But the more striking difference between then and now is not the audacity of these verses, but the psalmist’s willingness to admit his sin and abandon all excuses. Today, we prefer euphemisms and so “sins” become “mistakes,” “indiscretions,” “errors,” “slip-up,” “problems” or what have you. Not so here. The psalmist begs for mercy, and that requires an admission of sin. He begs to be spared the consequences that flow from all his sins, so he can’t deny having committed them.

It’s said that when he was dying, St. Augustine asked that the Psalms be hung from the wall facing his bed. Famous for his years of flagrant sinning, Augustine sought the comfort of the Psalms as he prepared to meet God face to face. The Psalms ought to give us courage and confidence as we reflect on our own lives and on the struggles, sins, and “enemies” that afflict us. They teach us to plead without restraint, to hold nothing back in begging for God’s mercy. I’m “skin and bones,” says the psalmist. “I am like a desert owl/ like an owl among the ruins” whose mournful cry and solitary life make it the very emblem of desolation. Such talk is not born of arrogance or overconfidence, but from a deep conviction that God is merciful and loves us like a parent.

It will be this compassion that overwhelms the nations and fills them with awe. They will have no choice but to glorify God when they see the marvel of his merciful love. It’s that conviction that enables the psalmist to ask that God not end his life too soon and that God let his children and their children stand before Him in peace. The psalmist’s conviction must be ours. Knowing Jesus also prayed these Psalms, we can make these words our own means of turning to the Lord with passion and sincerity.

Reflection Questions: Do you ever turn to the Lord with the kind of open, honest and passionate pleading we see in this Psalm? Do you trust God enough to storm heaven’s gates with your prayers? A requisite for praying the Penitential Psalms is an awareness of our sinfulness. Can you look honestly in the mirror admitting what you see? If that is challenging, can you be patient with yourself and ask God for the gift of trust? When you pray, do you focus more on the chasm between your sin and God’s goodness or on the ocean of God’s mercy vs. your need?

REMEMBERING ST. PETER ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH –

TRANSFER ON DEATH DESIGNATIONS: Previous articles have provided guidance on making planned gifts to the St. Peter Roman Catholic Church Endowment Fund or to St. Peter Roman Catholic Church using your last will and testament or trust. During 2018, four other options for making such a gift will be discussed in the Bulletin. These include a gift made directly from an existing bank or brokerage account (“transfer on death”), a retirement plan (e.g. IRA), an insurance policy, and by a gift annuity. This article focuses on transfers that are made on death from a bank or brokerage account.

Ohio law provides that the owner of a bank or brokerage account can designate who will receive the balance of such account upon the death of the owner the account. The process is as easy as requesting the appropriate form from the institution at which the account is established. Generally, the form will have a reference to “transfer upon death,” but some institutions may use other words for this description. The form would be completed to state that the account would be transferred to “St. Peter Roman Catholic Church” or to “The Catholic Foundation for the benefit of the St. Peter Roman Catholic Church Endowment Fund” upon the death of the owner. The owner would sign the form which would be retained by the bank or brokerage firm. Whatever amount remains in the account at the death of the owner would become the property of the named transferee (i.e., beneficiary). The transfer upon death beneficiary can be revoked or modified by the owner of the account. For information, the St. Peter Roman Catholic Church Endowment Fund is administered by The Catholic Foundation.

Example: Ann Adams has a savings account at a local bank having a current balance of \$25,000. She obtained a “transfer on death” form from the bank which she completed to provide: Upon my death, 50% of the account will be transferred to The Catholic Foundation for the benefit of the St. Peter Roman Catholic Church Endowment Fund, and 50% of the account balance will be transferred to my son, James Adams. Upon the death of Ann, the bank will pay 50% of the account balance to the St. Peter Roman Catholic Church Endowment Fund and 50% to James. The account balance could be more or less than the current \$25,000 at the time of Ann’s death. You can contact your bank or broker to obtain the correct form and guidance on how to complete the form. If a member of the Planned Giving Committee can assist, please feel free to contact us.
