**REMEMBER ST. PETER ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH –
PLANNED GIVING WITH LIFE INSURANCE**

This is the third installment of a four-part series on four options for making planned gifts to the St. Peter Roman Catholic Church Endowment or to St. Peter Roman Catholic Church. Transfers on death from an existing bank or brokerage account were discussed in the first installment. Gifts of retirement plan funds were discussed in the second installment. Gift annuity funded gifts will be discussed in the final installment. This installment will discuss funding such gifts through life insurance.

Life insurance has often been purchased to provide for the future needs of loved ones. Common examples of such needs are to (1) pay off debts including final expenses, (2) provide for planned events such as college and weddings (3) replace the income that might be lost upon the death of a breadwinner, and (4) avoid the need to liquidate a family business or farm to pay estate taxes.

Often the reason for the original purchase of the life insurance becomes less important over time. As time passes and dependents become economically self-sufficient and annual costs of supporting the household are reduced (home mortgage and other debt is paid down, for instance), the need to supplement the family income in the event of the death of a breadwinner may become less critical. Also, as the estate tax landscape has changed (the Ohio death tax has been repealed and the federal estate tax exemption amount has been doubled), the reliance on life insurance to pay estate taxes and safeguard the family farm or business may be reduced or eliminated.

Life insurance can play an important and legitimate role in charitable gift planning. The policy owner may simply name a charity as one of the beneficiaries under a life insurance policy, by stipulating a set dollar amount or a percentage of the total benefit. Alternately, donors can gift life insurance they purchased on their lives to charities, often with the donor agreeing to pay the periodic premiums, or donors could assign policy benefits to a charity, such as policy dividends.

As with all gifts of noncash assets the deductible amount is the fair market value at the time of the gift. The IRS has held in revenue rulings that the value of a life insurance policy is the interpolated terminal reserve (which is generally fairly close to the cash value) plus the unearned premium. Additionally, future premiums paid by the donor on the policy will also qualify as charitable contribution deductions in the amount of the premium paid.

There are numerous techniques and transactions for using life insurance as part of charitable gift planning. There are also some prohibited transactions to be avoided in gifting life insurance. Detailed discussion of such arrangements is beyond the scope of this article. Competent insurance and estate planning advisors, including those at the Catholic Foundation and on St. Peter's Planned Giving Committee, can help anyone who would like to know more regarding these and other strategies.

Gifts of life insurance policies to St. Peter Roman Catholic Church Endowment or to St. Peter Roman Catholic Church are excellent ways to provide long-term financial support to the mission of our parish.
