Prayer for Guidance







Why are we showing you DRAFTS?




- With respect to whatever parish structure models might be necessary, which would you rather?
 - I would prefer that diocesan leaders provide some options for me and my people to provide feedback (78%)
 - I would prefer that the clergy and lay people create the options from scratch for diocesan leaders to provide feedback (22%)
- Your priests, key parish leaders, and facilitators did not create these drafts.

US Context: Sacramental Decline






U.S. Catholic Church Sacramental Forecast 1990 - 2040 (000's)



- Catholic marriages are down 55% since 1990.
- 1 in 5 children baptized do not receive First Communion.
- 2 in 5 children baptized are not confirmed.
- 85% of children confirmed stop practicing their faith by age 21.



Columbus Attendance declined 18% in 10 years



Smaller parishes have fewer financial resources

Percent of Parishes by 2019 Weekend Attendance



- More than half of parishes have fewer than 500 people at Mass on the weekend.
- These parishes average annual offertory is between \$131k - \$279k.
- Parishes with at least 500 attendees have at least double, if not triple the resources to invest in maintenance but more importantly ministry and outreach.

Columbus Priests available in 6-8 years



Projected Number of Active Priests 2030 (including religious and newly ordained)	80
Reduce for priests not assigned to parishes or on leave (10%)	(8)
Priests available for parish ministry	72
Parishes with 2 priests assumed (>1,500 weekly attendance)	(12)
Priests available for assignment as pastors	60

Parish Sustainability Index



- Measures key areas for projected long term sustainability of parishes.
- Each parish scored on a range of 1 3 points per area, for a total maximum of 21 points.

Green >15 points

Strong and sustainable for the future

Yellow 11-15 points

Concerns exist for future sustainability

Red < 10 points

Future sustainability will be difficult




- - 1. These models are simply a starting point we want and hope for other options to emerge from you.
- 2. No decisions have been made Bishop is looking for your feedback.
- 3. The more specific your feedback, the better constructive, thoughtful feedback will help refine and add to these options.
- 4. **No change is not an option** the parish landscape across the country is shifting rapidly and requires bold strategies.
- 5. **Implementation will take years** whatever decisions are made will require thoughtful implementation over 3-5 years and longer.





What happens now?




