## Fr. Schalk's Vision for St. Peter and St. Joan of Arc

The purpose of this message is twofold. First, I would like to invite you to the Town Hall meetings that will take place at St. Peter and St. Joan of Arc at the end of this month. These meetings will allow our community to discuss constructively the blessings and challenges of bringing these two parishes together. Your participation in one of the Town Hall meetings would be greatly appreciated.

I also would like to share my vision for St. Peter and St. Joan of Arc with you. Since being appointed pastor in July 2023, I have continually stressed unity and evangelization. These priorities have given focus and direction to our newly combined church family.

When I speak of unity at St. Peter and St. Joan of Arc, I speak of the following:

1. Merging into one team the employees from both parishes;
2. Integrating and/or consolidating our ministries;
3. Addressing pastoral needs with the resources available at both campuses.

I have been edified by the spirit of collaboration shown by so many parishioners who have helped bring about greater unity between St. Peter and St. Joan of Arc. In the past several months, there have been countless displays of goodwill, sacrifice, and generosity that have made this transition possible. I am grateful for the small victories we have had, and I also recognize that we still have a long way to go.

One of the keys to establishing genuine unity between St. Peter and St. Joan of Arc is respecting the diversity between us. That is to say, the two churches are unique and must remain so. This is a difficult balancing act: we embrace the fact that the two parishes are indeed better together while accepting the fact that each campus has its own history, gifts, and struggles.

When we achieve this balance, then we can turn our attention more fully to evangelization. That is our parish's mission: to increase the Kingdom of God and to lead more and more souls into a meaningful relationship with Christ.

Evangelization means introducing others to Jesus, accompanying them on their ever-deepening journey of faith, and empowering them to use their

gifts for the Kingdom and share their own story of how God has impacted their lives.

In the context of St. Peter and St. Joan of Arc, I have identified four pillars that will orient our newly combined church family in the work of evangelization.

- **Community.** We need ministries, activities, and events that allow people to share life and build friendships. From youngest to oldest, we want all parishioners to feel as if there is value in connecting with other members of the church and investing their time at St. Peter and St. Joan of Arc. In addition to our worship on the weekend, we should have many opportunities for participation in an authentic community of faith.
- **Communion with God.** Our life's goal is eternal union with God. That means the members of St. Peter and St. Joan of Arc should have opportunities to grow in the spiritual life and strengthen our practice of prayer. In this parish family, we seek a personal relationship with God, offer him our love, and enjoy real communion with him in every season of life.
- **Commitment to the Poor.** Our church family has been blessed. We must be intentional about generously sharing our material resources, constantly challenging ourselves to reach more individuals and families in need. We know that to be Christian is to commit to caring for the less fortunate; to do so is to serve Christ himself.
- **"Come and see."** This must be our mantra. As we strive to build community, deepen our communion with God, and commit to serving the poor – that is to say, when we have a parish authentically living its mission, then it will be easy to invite family members and friends, neighbors, and co-workers, to experience the life of our combined parish family. With a healthy pride, we should let others know that they are welcome to come and see what God is doing at St. Peter and St. Joan of Arc.

In one of my earliest homilies in this community, I preached about a "Mustard Seed Mentality." In that well-known parable, Jesus explains that the mustard seed, though small, has the potential to grow into a large bush where the birds of the sky make their nests. It is critical for us to adopt this "Mustard Seen Mentality" because St. Peter and St. Joan of Arc have tremendous potential for growth. With the help of God's grace, we can work together to evangelize, making our parish flourish.

and announce to it the message that I will tell you.”

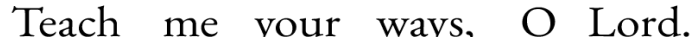
So Jonah made ready and went to Nineveh,

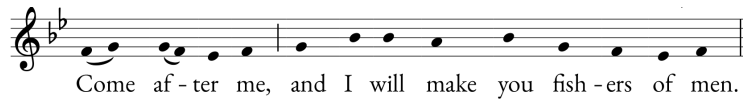
