From the Pastor's Desk

We find ourselves in Ordinary Time, the liturgical season between Christmas and Lent. Why is it called Ordinary? This name comes from the Latin word "ordinalis," referring to "numbers in a series." The Church numbers the weeks of the year, and we ask God to bless these days when we are neither feasting (like Christmas) nor fasting (like Lent).

Please make time in your calendar to participate in a parish Town Hall meeting (see the blurb below for the dates and times). These meetings will be an opportunity for members of our community to share comments and ask questions about Saint Peter and Saint Joan of Arc coming together. I need to hear feedback from parishioners about this transition in the life of our churches – both the blessings and the challenges.

I want to highlight the tremendous work of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., whom our nation honors with a holiday this Monday. I was recently in Montgomery, Alabama, where Dr. King helped organize a bus boycott that further intensified the civil rights movement in our country in the 1950s. Dr. King was thoroughly inspired by his Christian faith, and continual prayer was what sustained his nonviolent efforts. We continue to pray for justice in our land and the courage to follow our Christian principles in doing what is right even when it is not popular.

Speaking of social justice, know that I will be traveling to Washington, D.C. this week for the 51st annual March for Life. During the March, I will walk with tens of thousands of others in our nation's capital to promote the dignity of every person, from the womb to the tomb. Please pray for all the participants in this year's March for Life and a greater respect for human life throughout our world.



FIRST READING 1 Sm 3: 3b-10, 19

Samuel was sleeping in the temple of the LORD where the ark of God was.

The LORD called to Samuel, who answered, "Here I am."

Samuel ran to Eli and said, "Here I am. You called me."

"I did not call you," Eli said. "Go back to sleep."

So he went back to sleep.


St. Peter and St. Joan of Arc are blessed to have both of our campuses receive a grant from the Catholic Foundation during its recent Responsive Grant cycle.


The Saint Peter Campus received \$8,000 to support our Catholic Apostolic Family Faith Encounter (CAFFE).



This study meets at St. Peter on Tuesdays at 7:30 p.m. and on Wednesdays at 9:30 a.m. All women are invited!


