From the Pastor's Desk

This weekend, the Church celebrates the Feast of the Epiphany. We hear once again the familiar story of the Magi following the star to Bethlehem. They are seeking the newborn King, whom they honor and adore. Throughout our lives, we imitate these astrologers from the East. That is to say, we continue to seek Christ because there is always more to discover as we pursue a deeper relationship with the Son of God. He reveals Himself to us in new and different ways as we offer Him the gift of ourselves in every season of our lives. What a blessing to follow the star of our faith and to find Jesus each day anew.

Typically, we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord on the Sunday following the Epiphany. This year, however, the Baptism of the Lord is celebrated on Monday, January 8. Jesus' Baptism is the very beginning of His ministry. In the waters of the Jordan, Jesus hears the voice of the Father say, "You are my beloved Son," and the Holy Spirit descends upon Him. Jesus is then sent to preach the Good News and build God's Kingdom. Perhaps there are members of our community who are experiencing for the first time the rich love of God the Father. Perhaps there are others who are now trusting the guidance of the Holy Spirit with greater conviction. Know that the gifts and graces you received at your Baptism are still at work in you! God – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit – desires to renew you in your Catholic faith! Like Jesus, you are being sent to do amazing things for the Kingdom in 2024.

That is a great place to end: our resolutions for the New Year. I ask that you consider the spiritual life when making your commitments for 2024. How are you going to put God first? What are you doing to make prayer a priority? Where is God asking you to serve? Let me suggest sharing your "religious resolutions" with people who love you and share your beliefs. In order to be successful in the spiritual life, we need the help of friends and community. There are others who are making goals related to their relationship with God in the New Year, and it is good for us to be there to support them as well.



When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod, behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? Assembling all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. They said to him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it has been written through the prophet: And you, Bethlehem, land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; since from you shall come a ruler, who is to shepherd my people Israel." Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed for their country by another way.
