



This weekend's gospel reminds us of the importance of stewardship. God has blessed us abundantly. Now, we have the responsibility to use well the blessings we have received. In other words, God calls us to share generously our Time, Treasure, Talent, and Testimony. Such generosity grows our faith. The paradox of the Christian life is that the more we give, the more we receive. When we invest heavily in the Kingdom of God, we open ourselves up to an increase in God's grace, mercy, and love. Pouring ourselves out is what fills us up.

Speaking of blessings, we take time this week as a nation to give thanks for all that God has done for us. Thanksgiving Day reminds me of the central mystery of our religion: the Eucharist. 
