From the Pastor's Desk

This Sunday, February 11, is the World Day of the Sick. Pope Saint John Paul II instituted this annual observation to draw the Church's attention to those who suffer from illness, as well as those who care for them. Because it is the World Day of the Sick, we will have the opportunity for parishioners to receive the Anointing of the Sick after each Mass. Any adult Catholic who is struggling with serious illness of any kind may receive the sacrament. Those who are advanced in years and those anticipating surgery are also encouraged to receive the Anointing of the Sick.

This Wednesday, we will begin our forty-day preparation for Easter. During the holy season of Lent, the Lord invites us to experience genuine renewal. If you have not done so already, please take time to pray about what sort of spiritual disciplines you are going to undertake from Ash Wednesday on. My suggestion would be to use Lent to make a permanent change or to build a new habit that will continue for a lifetime. Maybe you want to give up soda for good. Or perhaps you want to read the Bible for five minutes before going to bed every night. Maybe you want to pray the Rosary or listen to Catholic radio on the way to work. Lent 2024 is a chance for the Holy Spirit to shape our lives in a lasting way.

Please note that the Provincial of the Theatine Fathers for the United States, Father Antonio Flores, is visiting Saint Peter Church this weekend to discuss the five hundredth anniversary of their religious community. I am grateful for the Theatine priests who serve in the life of our parish family: Father David Arroyo, Father Victor Mendez, and Father Salvador Cisneros. Their presence in the Diocese of Columbus means that we are a part of the yearlong celebration of this milestone for their order. May God continue to make fruitful the ministry of the Theatine Fathers!

Regulations for Fasting and Abstinence

Abstinence from meat is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and each Friday in Lent by Catholics 14 years old and older. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by Catholics from age 18 to 58. Fasting means limiting oneself to one full meal. Two additional smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength. Eating between meals is not permitted on days of fasting.

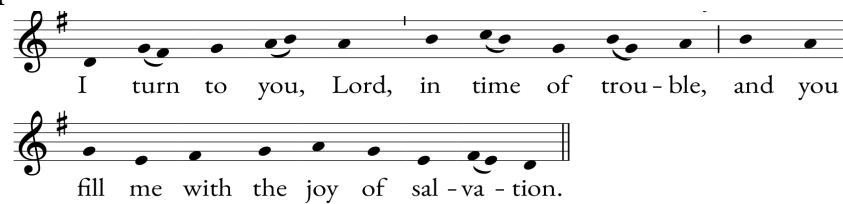



Summary of Town Hall Meetings

Three Town Hall Meetings recently took place in our community, two in English and one in Spanish. During these gatherings, Father Schalk spoke about his vision for a parish that is unified yet diverse: Saint Peter – Saint Joan of Arc. He outlined the importance of:

- 1.) Individuals and families sharing life (Community),
- 2.) Opportunities for parishioners to encounter Christ and develop their relationship with Him (Communion),
- 3.) The church's extensive social outreach (Commitment to the Poor), and
- 4.) Our efforts to evangelize and share our experience of faith ("Come and see").

Parishioners then reflected on the blessings and challenges of bringing together Saint Peter and Saint Joan of Arc. What was shared was heartfelt, constructive, and, for the most part, very encouraging. As challenges were raised, solutions were likewise offered.

Some of the key themes from the Town Hall Meetings included:

Clergy – We are blessed with wonderful priests and deacons; however, some individuals struggle with the accents of our foreign-born priests.

Merging the ministries of the two churches – There are now more resources, talents, and possibilities for collaboration at Saint Peter – Saint Joan of Arc, but we need to get to know each other better. We want to make sure the larger community at Saint Joan of Arc does not simply engulf the smaller community at Saint Peter. Engaging more parishioners for ministries, especially young people, will be critical. Moreover, we need to refocus our efforts to integrate our English speakers with our Spanish speakers. Our diversity of cultures and languages is both a blessing and a challenge.

Mass times – The Mass schedule between the two campuses is now aligned, though additional changes may better serve the needs of parishioners.

Liturgy – There is room for improvement when it comes to our Sunday worship. For example, the sound systems and the liturgical music need attention.

Communication – There are more ways to facilitate communication in the life of our parish. If parishioners knew more about opportunities to serve (for example, if we hosted a Ministry Fair), we would generate greater engagement in the community.
