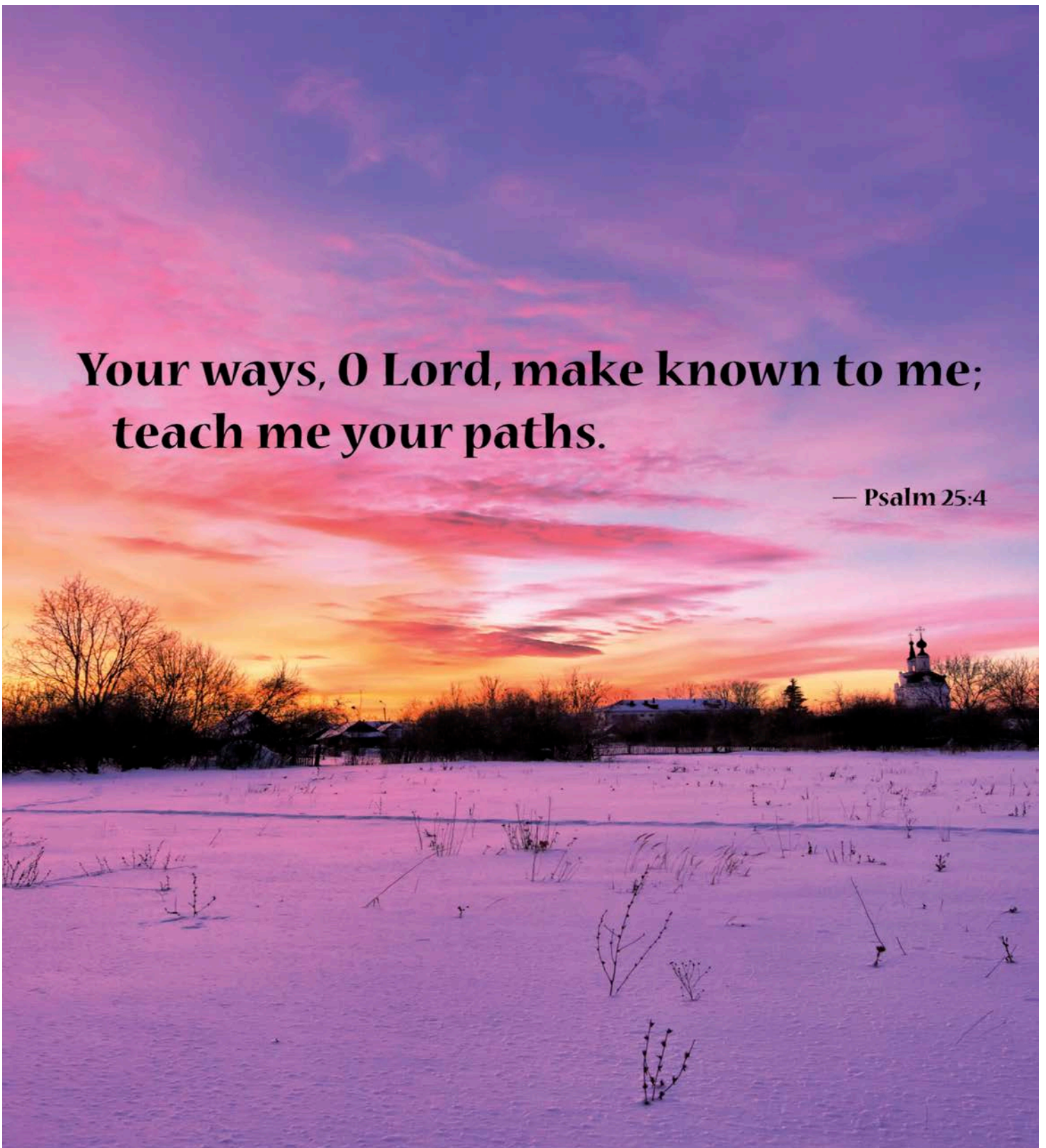

From the Pastor's Desk

One of the blessings of Lent is the Catholic devotion to the Stations of the Cross. This centuries-old spiritual practice helps us enter into the mystery of Jesus' passion and death. With our prayers, we journey with Christ who carries his cross to Calvary. The Stations of the Cross move our hearts as we reflect deeply and sorrowfully on our Savior's suffering.

Countless authors have crafted prayers that correspond to the fourteen stations, and there are innumerable varieties of meditations for this devotion. For example, there are Stations of the Cross for Children, Scriptural Stations of the Cross, and Stations of the Cross from the perspective of Mary. On Fridays during Lent, Saint Peter and Saint Joan of Arc are using the version penned by Saint Alphonsus Liguori.

Let me encourage you to incorporate the Stations of the Cross into your Lenten practices this year. Perhaps that means praying with the community in church on Fridays. You can also pray in your home with your family or by yourself (if you need a resource for this, you can search for one online or visit a local Catholic bookstore.) If you are feeling inspired and creative, you can write your own reflection for each of the fourteen stations.

Know that all the parishioners of Saint Peter and Saint Joan of Arc are in my prayers throughout these forty days. Please remember to pray for one another. May God bless our parishes abundantly during Lent, and may we all experience authentic renewal as we grow in our love for Christ.
