



#### **Anointing of the Sick**

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will be available during the Saturday vigil Mass and all of the Sunday Masses the weekend of February 10th and 11th.

The Rite of Anointing tells us there is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament; the primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing by which the sick person receives the Holy Spirit's gift of peace and courage.

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
