From the Pastor's Desk

Let me thank everyone who donated last weekend to the seminarian fund. Between Saint Peter and Saint Joan of Arc, we have thus far been able to raise \$14,376 (without counting online contributions). This display of generosity is a sign of our parishes' commitment to supporting vocations to the priesthood and religious life.

Next Saturday, March 9, I will be at the Basilica of Saint Mary of the Assumption in Lancaster, Ohio, for a diaconate ordination. Three seminarians of the Diocese of Columbus, Kevin Girardi, Joseph Rolwing, and Sam Severance, will be ordained transitional deacons.

A transitional deacon is a deacon who will eventually be ordained a priest. For example, Deacon Jason Fox, a seminarian from Saint Joan of Arc, is currently a transitional deacon. He will be ordained a priest for the Diocese of Columbus on Saturday, May 18, and will celebrate his first Mass at Saint Joan of Arc the very next day.

In our parishes, we are also blessed with six permanent deacons. A permanent deacon is someone who is ordained for service in the Church but will not later be ordained a priest. Our permanent deacons assist at the liturgy, take on various leadership roles, and support the ministry that takes place at Saint Peter and Saint Joan of Arc. I am grateful for their service to our community.

I am also grateful for several men from Saint Peter and Saint Joan of Arc who are in preparation for their ordination to the permanent diaconate. My hope is that we will have even more permanent deacons serving our community in the years ahead. It takes a great deal of faith and courage to say "Yes" to that call.

Of course, not everyone is called to the priesthood or religious life. Not everyone is called to the permanent diaconate or marriage. But we are all called to live our lives as a generous gift to God and others. I thank all our parishioners who say "Yes" to the call to follow Jesus and to serve in his Church. May this season of Lent be a time to renew that "Yes."
