

Introducing the SPJOA Legacy Committee

Saint Peter parish has had a Legacy Committee since 2007 and its mission is to educate parishioners about various ways that gifts can be made to the parish in their estate planning and inspire parishioners to make such gifts. Those who included such gifts as part of their planning and who informed the parish of the planned gift were recognized as a member of the Simon Society. Saint Joan of Arc did not have a legacy committee or does any other organization at the parish with a similar responsibility. As part of the process of unifying our two parishes, Father Schalk requested that one organization serve the combined Saint Peter Saint Joan of Arc parish.

The Transition Process

At the beginning of 2024, the existing committee expanded and added a parishioner from Saint Joan of Arc. (Additional members will be solicited and added throughout the year.) The first order of business was changing the name to SPJOA Legacy Society to reflect our combined parish name. This will be the only moniker used, which will encompass the planning group and the recognition society. All current members of the Simon Society and all future parishioners who name Saint Peter Saint Joan of Arc as a beneficiary in their planning will be added as members of the SPJOA Legacy Society.

What Does the SPJOA Legacy Society Do?

The mission is to educate parishioners about legacy giving in their planning and to inspire parishioners to name Saint Peter Saint Joan of Arc as a beneficiary of such planning. Education is carried out by way of periodic bulletin articles regarding specific ways to make legacy gifts and by holding an annual seminar on "End of Life" planning, which will be held in the fall (watch for future announcements). The website and Flocknote will be utilized in the future. In addition, parishioners who have informed the parish of a legacy gift to the parish and are members of the SPJOA Legacy Society will be invited to attend an annual "thank-you" Mass and dinner. The members of the planning group will be available to assist parishioners in their planning process.

What Are Legacy Gifts?

A legacy gift is generally made within documents that you prepare currently, but the gift itself is not made until the time of death. Your will, trust, retirement plan (401K or IRA), bank accounts, investment accounts, insurance policies, and real estate are all possible vehicles for such gifts in your planning. Future communication to parishioners will provide more information on these giving options.

What About Parishioners Who Have Already Named the Parish as a Beneficiary in Their Planning?

If your planning documents have already named the parish as a beneficiary, you can become a member of the SPJOA Legacy Society by notifying the parish of such gift.

Who Should Make a Legacy Gift?

The invitation to name the parish as a beneficiary in your planning is extended to every parishioner. The size or amount of such a gift is your decision. All gifts large or small demonstrate your love for our parish and its programs.

Why Are Legacy Gifts Important for the Parish?

Saint Peter Saint Joan of Arc will receive your legacy gift in the future, which will stabilize the longterm financial needs of the parish. Such gifts assure that the parish life and evangelization programs currently conducted by the parish will continue for future generations and that unanticipated expenditures can be made. A future bulletin article will explain the relationship that the parish has with The Catholic Foundation, and how endowments created by the parish and administered by The Catholic Foundation further enhance the financial condition of the parish.

Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion Training

Saint Peter Saint Joan of Arc will hold four training sessions for Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (EMHCs) who assist the Clergy in distributing the Body of Christ during Mass. These sessions are for retraining current EMHCs and for anyone interested in joining the ministry.

Join us at one of these sessions: Sunday, April 21, 2024, after 1:00 p.m. Mass at Saint Peter (in Spanish) Saturday, May 4, 2024, at 1:00 p.m. at Saint Joan of Arc Monday, May 6, 2024, at 9:30 a.m. at Saint Joan of Arc Tuesday, May 7, 2024, at 7:00 p.m. (after 6:30 Mass) at Saint Peter

If you were trained in March 2024 as an EMHC for distributing Holy Communion to homebound parishioners, you are NOT REQUIRED to attend one of these training sessions but are welcome to join us.

All trained EMHCs are asked to participate in one of the Commisioning Rites that will take place during all Masses on the Solemnity of Pentecost, on Saturday, May 18, and Sunday, May 19.

In the Catholic Diocese of Columbus, EMHCs are commissioned for a two-year term of service, after which they are asked to renew their training and be recommissioned.
